— A Pastoral Word from Sydnor

Advent 2018

As we enter the season of Advent, we look to the arrival, the appearance of God in our lives. God's arrival has long been portrayed as violent and chaotic, as disrupting the current world order. Mark 13:25 foretells, "And the stars of heaven shall fall, and the powers that are in heaven shall be shaken."

Of course the coming of God will disrupt the order of this world! Surely we never imagined that our current political and economic systems were in any sense eternal! The season of Advent challenges us to acknowledge that our personal and corporate enterprises must eventually fail—that behind them is something much greater.

What is that greater something? I believe it has less to do with power as we usually think of it—e.g., political rule or military might. The power that undoes the world and brings us to our knees is more like a rose blooming in winter, a child born to a poor immigrant couple, a heart of stone becoming a heart of flesh. As Angelus Silesius wrote, "If in your heart you make a manger for his birth, then God will once again become a child on earth."

Do not underestimate such power, as small and tenuous as it may seem. It is a power fully capable of upending the existing order. The love of God in Jesus Christ can topple the mighty from their thrones and bring hope and healing to the lost and outcast. Thanks be to God for the Advent season. Thanks be to God for the promise of his coming. Thanks be to God for the victory of his love in Jesus Christ.

MUSIC NOTES

The Chancel Choir will present the sacred cantata **Sing the Songs of Bethlehem**, A Service of Lessons and Carols, by K. Lee Scott on Sunday, December 16, 2018. The growing popularity of *The Service of Lessons and Carols* is easy to understand considering the wealth of carol-based musical settings and the special chemistry which is created when these settings are laced together with the scriptural passages which inspired them. In this cantata, the group of carols, though arranged or composed by one composer, provide a variety of moods, textures and compositional effects for needed contrast. The prayers and scriptural passages follow rather closely the renowned service form from King's College, Cambridge, England, with slight adjustments. Accompanying instruments for this presentation of **Sing the Songs of Bethlehem** include organ, flute, violins, viola, and cello.
